- 1. No release aids are permitted.
- 2. A sight with 4 or 5 fixed reference points will be allowed and neither the sight nor any reference point shall be moved during a round.
- 3. Pin sights are to be of straight stock from point of anchor to sighting points, held nearer horizontal than vertical within the sight, with only one sighting reference possible from each pin or reference point. Hooded pins or scope sights are not permitted. The use of an artificial light source attached to the sight that illuminates the pins is permitted.
- Optical devices that assist the archer to obtain consistency in eye alignment and anchor point are not permitted.
- 5. The use of a leveling device is permitted as part of the pin/brush guard and shall be considered part of the pin/brush guard for all measurements and references.
- Any type of arrow rest is permitted
- 7. Only one permanent nocking point is allowed on the string. The nocking point may be marked by one or two nock locators or a "D" loop.
- 8. Any type of release aid is permitted.
- 9. A kisser button or string peep sight will be permitted but not both. A lens that is incorporated into the peep sight is permitted.
- 10. Pin Guards/brush guards may be used provided that the distance between the bottom of the top guard and the top pin must be greater than the distance between the top pin and the next highest pin. The same clearance as for the top sight pin applies also to the bottom pin and the bottom guard.
- 11. All arrows used shall be identical in length, weight, diameter, fletching and nocks, without regard for color, with allowance for wear and tear.

- 12. Brush buttons in their proper places at the recurve tip of the bow, string silencers no closer than twelve inch above or below the nocking point and bow quiver installed on the opposite side of the sight window with no part of the quiver visible in the bow window is permitted.
- 13. One straight stabilizer, coupling device included, if used, not exceeding twelve inch as measured from the back of the bow may be used. No forked stabilizer or any type of counter balance will be legal. The plunger (where the stabilizer is screwed in) is part of the stabilizer.
- Draw weight shall not be adjusted during any one round.
- 15. One or two string stoppers may be used. The bracket of the string stoppers may only have attachments to allow the bracket to function and may not incorporate attachments that give the bracket the function as a counter weight.

Historical Bow - (HB)

- 1. The recognition of the classic bow (also called historical or primitive bow) shall be based on the accepted design and usage during the period preceding the year 1900.
- There shall be no distinction between the different configurations of bow designs or of materials used.
- There shall be no class grades.
- The bow shall be either a self-wood or composite bow.
- The inclusion of a form of arrow rest or shelf as well as a sight window cut-in shall be permitted, provided such meet the classic configuration of the bow which has established historical precedence.
- 6. The bow shall be constructed of wood or materials that were used during the period of the bow's historical usage. Modern materials such as carbon, glass fiber and epoxy may not be used. The use of historic glues such as bone glue and hot tree resin is not permitted and only modern glues and adhesives shall be used for the riser and limbs! The standard bowstring material shall be polyester. Historical (such as flax or sinew) and/or modern bowstring materials (such as Kevlar, etc.) may not be used.
- 7. Arrows shall be of wood, fletched with natural feather, and must be of the same fletch and pile, without regard for color. The arrows must be free of any marks or blemishes that can be used as sighting aids and shall not vary in length by more than 25mm at the start of the competition. Modern arrow points or piles as well as modern nocks shall be permitted. Nocks that are cut into the shaft are only permitted when these are strengthened with appropriate materials.
- Accessories such as woven nocking point indicators and thumb rings shall be permitted, provided that such accessory was used during the historic use of the bow.

- 9. The onus shall rest with the archer to ensure that all the equipment that is used for the tournament is historically correct. The shooter shall show documented proof of the correctness of the equipment if so asked by the technical controllers at the tournament.
- 10. For all tournaments below the Sectional level, all Historical Bow archers may shoot at Youth distances at the discretion of each State or Club.

- 1. A one, two, or three piece straight ended bow constructed of wood or laminated wood with nonadjustable limbs. When the bow is braced, the string must not touch the limbs between the notches on the limb. The belly and the back of the bow may have carbon or fiberglass on them.
- 2. The belly of the bow must be free of any marks or blemishes that can be used as sighting aids.
- 3. The bow may contain a window and an arrow shelf. No mechanical or elevated rests may be used.

Traditional Recurve Bow (TR)

- 1. A recurve bow manufactured from wood, which can either be a one-piece bow or a bow that can be taken down in two or more parts.
- The riser or grip of the bow shall be made mainly from wood that may be laminated with glass or carbon fiber reinforced polymers, or similar materials.
- The limbs shall have a wood core which may be laminated on the outside, using glass or carbon fiber, or similar.
- 4. The arrow shall be shot from the hand or from the bow shelf. For protection against wear and tear, the shelf may contain a thin plate (leather or felt patch against the riser) and a piece of felt, rug or skin (or similar material) on the shelf.
- The riser shall be free of any markings or blemishes that may be used for sighting.
- Any additions to the bow for the purpose of stabilization, leveling, draw-weight reduction, sighting and/or draw checking are not permitted.
- An arrow rest, adjustable or non-adjustable, is not permitted.
- The bow must be shot with the "Mediterranean loose" aka split finger. A finger tab or glove is permitted.
- Face walking is not permitted.
- 10. Only one permanent nocking point is allowed, which may be marked by one or two nock locators. The use of a ball-nock is permitted.
- 11. Arrows shall be made of any material, fletched with natural feathers. The arrows shall be similar in material, length, weight, spine, diameter and nocks, regardless of color and with allowance for wear and tear.
- 12. Limb savers, string silencers and brush buttons are permitted and if used, must be at least 12 inches above or below the nocking point.

13. A bow quiver may be installed on the opposite side of the window, as long as no parts of the
quiver are visible in the window. If a bow quiver is installed, only arrows on this quiver shall be
shot during the competition.

J. Scoring

- 16. Scores will be recorded for all NFAA sanctioned events on two paper scorecards by the scorekeepers except as noted below. Scorecards will be picked up by each individual competitor so that the host can ensure each target group has the required amount of archers needed for eligible scoring. To accomplish this the host may change target assignments as necessary.
 - 16.1 At no time will competitors be asked to use their personal devices or use their personal plans and data to record scores. The electronic scoring devices (with at least an 80% charge) will be provided by NFAA. The devices provided by NFAA will be manageable for the location and uncumbersome to the competitors in regards to weight, dimensions, and functionality.
 - In the event the tournament is hosted at an indoor facility that has shown to be able to provide strong and consistent WIFI for the past two years, only then can electronic scorekeeping dependent on WIFI be utilized. The electronic scoring devices (with at least an 80% charge) will be provided by NFAA. Competitors will still be provided with two sets of paper scorecards, with the second set being blank and only to be utilized in the unlikely event of failure of electronic scoring. At the conclusion of the event, both sets of paper scorecards and the electronic scoring device will be returned. If electronic scoring was successfully completed and matches the paper scorecard with all required information provided, the archer will keep the paper scorecard that contains their signature and the signature of both scorekeepers. NFAA will retain the second set of blank paper scorecards.

- In locations that cannot show proof, or is credibly disputed to not provide consistent WIFI throughout the entire tournament site, if electronic scoring is to be employed, only electronic scorekeeping not dependent on WIFI may be used. The electronic scoring devices (with at least an 80% charge) will be provided by NFAA. Competitors will still be provided with two sets of paper scorecards, with the second set being blank and only to be utilized in the unlikely event of failure of electronic scoring. At the conclusion of the event, both sets of paper scorecards and the electronic scoring device will be returned. If electronic scoring was successfully completed and matches the paper scorecard with all required information provided, the archer will keep the paper scorecard that contains their signature and the signature of both scorekeepers. NFAA will retain the second set of blank paper scorecards.
- 16.4 Any time electronic scorekeeping is employed, NFAA will provide the electronic devices (with at least an 80% charge) with the designated scorekeeping program uploaded before the time of the event.
- At least one week before the event, NFAA will email the currently registered archers, if any, with notification of the electronic scoring requirement, as well as providing a link to a "Howto" video in the body of the email. If no archers are pre-registered for an event, or if the event will accept walk-on registrations the day of, NFAA will email all members one week prior to the event of the electronic scoring requirement. This email will also provide a link to a "Howto" video in the body of the email.

The "How-to" video must provide the following details:

- Display how to utilize the program to score for an archery tournament, including how to change an inputted score to the correct score and other basic functions
- Display how to navigate the program to change to different archers and ends/targets
- Display solutions to challenges that may arise while a competitor is utilizing the device with the assumption that a tournament official will not be easily or quickly accessible as can be the case in outdoor tournaments
- 16.6 For tournaments that do not require the archer to rove from one target to another at an indoor facility utilizing electronic scorekeeping, the NFAA provided electronic device (with a minimum of 80% charge) shall not weigh more than 2 pounds as the device may be left at an appropriate location by the target and will not be cumbersome to the archer. This device will also not exceed the following dimensions:

Weight: 2 pounds (before protective case, if any)

Height: 7.69 inches (195.4 mm) Width: 5.3 inches (134.8 mm) Depth: 0.25 inch (6.3 mm)

16.7 For tournaments that require the archer to rove from one target to another, whether an indoor or outdoor location utilizing electronic scorekeeping, the NFAA provided device (with a minimum charge of 80%) shall not weigh more than 1 pound, and will not exceed the following dimensions:

Weight: 1 pound (before protective case, if any)

Height: 7.69 inches (195.4 mm) Width: 5.3 inches (134.8 mm) Depth: 0.25 inch (6.3 mm)

The NFAA provided device (with a minimum of 80% charge) for electronic scoring utilized at outdoor locations, must also be rugged, durable, proven to accommodate various temperatures, and weather outdoor locations can and have undergone.

- This would be an unbearable cost to the NFAA. Providing devices is costly and requires the hosting club to have high-speed internet. Shipping one case of 45 tablets costs \$150 (this does not take into consideration the cost of renting the devices from the NFAAF). Shipping one box of equipment to set up the network for the tablets costs \$70. Using NFAA-provided devices also requires extra staff at events to manage the devices and set up the related equipment
- A recent update to the scoring app allows for ease of use with individuals' personal devices that does not require continuous internet data and saves battery (tested at Redding with 1400 archers)
- Any time that electronic scoring is implemented, archers receive emails with either instructions on how to use NFAA-provided devices (e.g. Indoor Nationals), or instructions and HOW-TO videos if we ask that archers use personal devices.
- It is incorrect to assume that 80% battery is a reasonable level of charge, as the amount of time devices will stay powered on depends on how old the item is and whether the screen is turned off in between scoring ends.

RATIONALE: (Describe briefly existing problem and expected benefit of proposed change)

I am a big proponent of providing a shortened, more "user friendly" field round option. Taking into consideration the extensive feedback of archers across New England over the past three years, gathered by our directors and councilman, I would like to present my/our recommendation for a "new" round. This round blends the classic field round with the International round to produce a time-shortened round that still has the "bones" and "feel" of the field round. It eliminates the birdie and 15, which people don't seem to care for. It eliminates the 80 yarder, which archer feedback has shown us is a barrier to new participation (time being the #1 barrier). There are also no walk-ups/fans, and only 10 targets per unit, saving time, making the round easier to understand and making courses easier to lay out and walk.

This round is endorsed by ALL New England Directors and Councilman.

Overview: 2 sets of 10 targets, laid out on a roving course in any order of distance

M. New England Round

1.- The "New England Round" is a 20-target round (10 targets per unit) shot at targets of varying distance, set in random order on a roving style course.

- 2.- Targets
- 2.1 Targets used will be the black and white (black bullseye) NFAA field round targets
- 2.2 Target size shall be as follows:

- 3. Shooting Position:
- 3.1 All shooting positions shall be long a straight line and parallel to the target butts.
- 3.2 Each target butt shall have a 4 shooting positions 30" in width.
- 3.3 The Distances shall be written on markers which are visible to the archer.
- 4. Shooting Rules:
- 4.1 Archers shall shoot in groups of 2 to 4 with 4 being preferred.
- 4.2 On the first target, archers will select one of four shooting positions: outer left, inner left, inner right, outer right, where they will stand at each of the first 10 targets (11 if the first target is used as practice).
- 4.3. On targets with multiple target faces, the two archers standing on the left shall shoot the target face(s) on the left and the two archers standing on the right shall shoot the target face(s) on the right.
- 4.4 On targets where 4 (35cm) faces are present, the two archers in the inside positions shall shoot the bottom targets on the target butt, and the two archers on the outside positions shall shoot the top targets on the target butt.
- 4.5 Upon completion of scoring 10 targets, archers shall switch shooting positions from left to right, and right to left, and from inner to outer and outer to inner.
- 4.6 Each archer shall shoot four arrows at each target.
- 4.8 The maximum distance for youth, traditional, longbow and barebow recurve for this round shall be 50 yards.
- 4.9 The maximum distance for cubs shall be 30 yards
- 4.10 Target size, layout and distances shot for each unit shall be as follows:

However, they may only shoot in the Sectional and the State Championship of the resident state for championship awards. The member must notify NFAA Headquarters in writing when changing residence. NFAA members may compete for awards in only one Indoor, one Outdoor and one 3-D Sectional; and only one Indoor, one Outdoor and one 3-D State tournament per calendar year. The member may shoot as a guest at any other time. Members may be privileged to change their state of residence two times during a calendar year.

The member may shoot as a guest at any other time.

Competitive Bowhunter

- 1. This style of shooting is for those with heavy tackle equipment used during hunting activities. This will be for the Adult Division only.
- 2. No device of any type (including arrow rest), that may be used for sighting, may be used or attached to the archer's equipment.
- 3. There shall be no device, mechanical or otherwise, in the sight window except the arrow rest and or cushion plunger.
- 4. Any part of the arrow rest more than ½ inch above the arrow shaft is deemed illegal in Competitive Bowhunter style.
- 5. An arrow plate extending more than ¼ inch above the arrow is deemed illegal in the Competitive Bowhunter style.
- 6. No Clickers, draw checks, or levels will be allowed. No laminations, marks, or blemishes may appear in the sight window.
- 7. A string of suitable material with a center serving and end servings of the same or different color may be used. One consistent nocking point only is permitted. Nocking point locators shall not extend more than one half (1/2") above or below the arrow nock when at full draw. Any marks, ties, or string attachment to the string (except Brush buttons and silencers properly located) shall invalidate it's use in this division.
- 8. One anchor point only is permitted.
- 9. An archer must draw and anchor the bowstring with the index finger touching the nock throughout the draw and release of the arrow, (if more than one finger is used) then the index finger is placed above the nock, the middle finger is placed below the nock, third finger if used must touch the middle finger; or the index finger must touch the bottom of the nock with the middle finger touching the index finger and the third finger, if used, touching the middle finger. Finger position may not be changed during competition.

- 10. Releases other than gloves, tabs, or fingers shall be deemed illegal. In cases of physical disability of the arms or hands, a chew strap may be used in place of fingers.
- 11. All arrows shall be identical in length, weight, diameter and fletching with allowances for wear and tear. Power on the arrow point shall be permitted as a visual aid.
- 12. Brush buttons, string silencers, positioned no closer than midway between the nocking point and where the string touches the wheel/cam, and bow quiver installed on the opposite side of the sight window, with no part of the quiver or attachments visible in the sight window, are legal. One straight stabilizer, coupling device included if used, which cannot exceed 12 inches at any time as measured from the back of the bow, B-bar, counterbalance, and string dampers, may be used in the Competitive Bowhunter style.
- 13. An archer will not be permitted to change draw weight of the bow during the round.
- 14. The pylon (string clearance bar) will be allowed in this shooting style if it is not located in the sight window.
- 15. No written memoranda shall be allowed.
- 16. During a round no adjustments may be made to the Bow and its related equipment unless an equipment failure is recognized.
- 17. Camouflage bows will be allowed.
- 18. Adult Division only.

RATIONALE: (Describe briefly existing problem and expected benefit of proposed change)

Several NY clubs/shops that have successful indoor cub/youth programs have been noticing in recent years that they are getting more and more student athletes that drop out of competitive archery at the age jump from cub to youth (transition at the age of 12) which we believe is a two-part problem.

First being, at the age of twelve (12) and the transition from 10 to 20 yards, the assumption here is that all student athletes are instantaneous, smarter, stronger and more focus when they turn 12 years old, which is not the case. As we all know the traits listed above that are all required to hold longer on target, with more focus, and at a greater distance is strenuous at best. Now add the accuracy component required to obtain similar score as they shot as a cub, has become a difficult task for these student athletics. Which leads to them being frustration and ultimately dropping archery as a competitive sport.

The second part of this equation is a more notable drop that some student athletes who are using more basic "beginner" bow setups that are far less accurate when they need to reach 20 yards instead of 10 yards. This is mostly due to the younger kids lack strength to draw more poundage at a shorter draw length.

We recognize that this is not a new problem, young student athletes have always been at a disadvantage when they move to 20 yards, however what has changed is the technology in the youth archery equipment of today. The higherend youth archery equipment with the higher draw weight let-off comes at cost that some parents cannot afford. So, they are trying to use the same equipment that was competitive at 11 years old and 10 yards, which is not competitive at 12 years old at 20 yards. Which is really discouraging to student athlete archers when they make that jump to 20 yards.

Therefore, in summary.

If the distance for youth were moved to 15 yards for Indoor NFAA rounds, instead of 20, we believe that youth archers scores would stay competitive, and student athletes would feel less discouraged when making the age jump from cub to youth. Retaining youth archers is the goal of this proposal. These student athletes are continuing to grow and mature as they develop and need an intermediate yardage like fifteen (15 yards) to aid in their continuous mental and physical development.

We recognize that this involves setting targets at a different distance, but we believe the good that could come out of this far outweighs the work it takes to move a few bales, or coordination it takes to assign specific bale numbers to youth registrants.

A Senior Division for archers ages 50 to 59, a Silver Senior Division for archers age 60 to 69, a Master Senior Division for archers age 70 to 79 and a Master Senior Plus Division for archers age 80 and older shall be provided at National and Sectional (Indoor and Outdoor) tournaments. Any archer may compete in only one Division; however, those age 50 to 59 may compete as either an Adult or Senior, those age 60 to 69 may compete - as either an Adult, Senior or Silver Senior, those age 70 to 79 may compete as either an Adult, Senior, Silver Senior or Master Senior, and those age 80 and older may compete as either an Adult, Senior, Silver Senior, Master Senior or Master Senior Plus.
