Protests at any tournament will require the archer to notify ANY judge that a protest is going to be filed. If protest is against another archer, protest notification has to be done in front of the accused.. The Judge that receives the request is to immediately notify the Tournament Director

Protest/Appeal must be done in writing and turned into the Tournament Director one hour after the day's shooting has concluded. Fees of 50 dollars National and 25 dollars Sectional must be submitted. All fees in USD.

Protest/Appeals committee is to consist of the Tournament Director, NFAA President, One Councilman, Two Directors, and two Judges.

Current text:

Protests arising at a tournament will be discussed and ruled upon by a committee consisting of the Tournament Director, NFAA President, One (1) councilman, and two (2) Directors, available at the tournament. The Councilman and Directors will be chosen at random by the Tournament Director. A list of the members of this committee shall be posted in public view. Any individual wishing to file a protest against another archer must inform that individual in the presence of a tournament official that a protest will be filed. Both individuals have the right to be present at the meeting of the protest committee. All protests must be submitted within one hour after the end of the day's shooting or, if indoors, the line on which the alleged offense occurred. A \$50.00 National and \$25.00 Sectional protest fee must accompany the written protest at National and Sectional tournaments, which will be refunded if the protest is upheld. No protest that is filed after the time limit will be considered or acted on.

In other archery organizations, the term "Barebow" is widely recognized as referring specifically to *Barebow Recurve*, which has led to significant confusion for new members registering for NFAA events. Renaming the existing division to *Barebow Compound* will clearly differentiate it from recurve-style archery. This change will create distinct *Barebow Compound* and *Barebow Recurve* divisions, eliminating confusion and aligning NFAA terminology with broader industry standards. The update will simplify the registration process and improve the overall experience for archers of all backgrounds.

The proposed tie-breaking method based on bonus ring counts and scores on a pre-designated tie-breaker target provides a fair, transparent, and efficient solution.

This rule has proven difficult to enforce consistently, particularly at the state level. Many state tournaments either do not apply the rule due to lack of awareness or face logistical challenges in doing so. Additionally, some state-level programs do not offer certain competitive opportunities (e.g., State Shooter of the Year awards) for junior divisions. As a result, we want to ensure that junior archers can still participate fully at the state level, even if that means competing outside their designated age division.

Furthermore, we recognize that archers may prefer to compete in different age divisions depending on the tournament format (e.g., indoor, 3D, field, or target), aligning with their individual strengths, goals, or development plans. Allowing this flexibility promotes broader participation, accommodates diverse program structures across states, and supports the growth and progression of each athlete.

Adding the Pro Chairman to the NFAA Council addresses both structural and strategic organizational needs. Currently, the Council consists of an even number of members, which can lead to tied votes and hinder decisive action. By adding the Pro Chairman, the Council will shift to an odd number of voting members, promoting more effective governance. The existing Immediate Past President seat contributes for only the first two years of a President's term, leaving a vacancy for the remainder of the term. With the Executive Secretary and Executive Director already providing institutional continuity as paid staff, maintaining a Past President seat is unnecessary under the current NFAA structure.

The Pro Chairman brings a unique perspective representing professional archers, an important and engaged segment of the NFAA membership. Including the Pro Chairman on the Council ensures they are actively involved in governance, gain firsthand understanding of NFAA operations, and improve communication between leadership and professional members. This engagement also helps attract and retain top-quality individuals for the Pro Chairman role, enhancing leadership within the Pro Division.

To make this addition financially responsible, travel costs for the Pro Chairman can be shared between the NFAA general fund and the NFAA Pro Division's general fund, reducing the financial impact on the organization while ensuring meaningful representation.

Purpose:

To create a data-driven system for managing age division offerings within each shooting style, ensuring sustainability and relevance based on actual participation, while preserving as many styles as possible.

Proposed Policy:

1. Shooting Style Evaluation Frequency:

Every two years, NFAA Headquarters will review participation in each recognized shooting style using data from the following events:

- National Indoor
- National Outdoor
- National Target

(Optional: include National Marked 3-D)

2. Participation Metrics:

Participation will be determined by the average number of total competitors (all age divisions and genders) per shooting style across the selected events.

3. Age Division Allocation Thresholds:

Based on the calculated average, age divisions will be offered as follows:

- o **1–4 participants**: Adult only
- o **5–9 participants**: Adult & Senior
- o **10–14 participants**: Adult, Senior & Silver Senior
- o **15+ participants**: All four divisions (Adult, Senior, Silver Senior, Master Senior)

4. New Shooting Styles:

All new shooting styles introduced will begin with **Adult only** divisions and be reviewed after two years. If they meet the minimum participation thresholds, additional age divisions may be added.

5. Recordkeeping:

Archers may request that their scores count toward a specific age division record, regardless of the division offered at the event, provided that the request is made to NFAA Headquarters before the competition begins.

6. Rationale:

This policy provides a scalable framework that rewards growing participation and helps preserve diversity in shooting styles. It aims to avoid the complete elimination of underperforming styles by scaling them back proportionally.

We propose updating the allocation of professional dues to better reflect current needs and actual spending practices. These adjustments formalize what is already being followed in practice: Increase the National Indoor Championship Prize Fund to \$27.50, reallocated from the tournament guarantee fund, since those funds were entirely used for Indoor Nationals.

- Add a National Target Championship Prize Fund of \$10.00 to strengthen prize support for target events.
- Replace the defunct Pro Points program allocation with a Shooter of the Year Prize Fund, maintaining the same \$20.00 contribution.
- Increase the NFAA Administration Cost to \$10.00 to account for credit card processing fees and staff time, which were already being covered through reallocations from the General Fund.
- Decrease the General Expense Fund to \$5.00, as it has seen minimal expenses in recent years. The remaining allocation will still provide approximately \$1,500 annually for general needs.

The dissolution of the reciprocal agreement with USA archery has limited our state organizations ability to encourage USA members to embrace NFAA indoor, target and field rounds without having to join the NFAA organization. This has led to decreased participation in our state tournaments. We experienced a 25% reduction in participation in our State tournaments after reciprocal agreement was rescinded.

By reinstating the acceptance of other members to participate in NFAA shoots, we can expose them to a different archery culture which accepts them.

At a state level, we anticipate achieving increased participation in state and sectional events. We anticipate a 3% increase in each of the next 3 years. The inclusion of other archery organizations is aligned with the Constitution Article II, Section I, to cooperate with other archery organizations to foster and perpetuate the use of use of the bow in accordance with its ancient and honorable traditions.

In review of the monetary impact, the income of NFAA membership for a family/individual to the NFAA versus the income associated with the tournament fees for State, Sectional and National was considered.

The NFAA state, sectional and national organizations stand to benefit from inclusion versus exclusion. Ex: entry fee costs for State, Sectional, and Nationals \$225. The cost of NFAA membership \$65.

- 2.1 See Appendix 6 for a picture of an Animal Round Target. The targets for this round are animal targets with the scoring area divided into three parts. The high scoring area is oblong while the low scoring area is the area between the high scoring area and the "hide and hair" line or "feathers", as the case may be. The area between the "hide and hair" line to the outside of the carcass is considered a non-scoring area. A bonus dot is located in the middle of the high scoring area and colored SUNSET ORANGE on dark targets and light targets. The bonus dot scoring will be mandatory at NFAA National and Sectional Field Championships and optional at other events. An arrow shaft must touch the bonus dot to be counted in the next higher value. Arrows touching the orientation line will not count for the higher value.
- 2.2 The high scoring area of Group No. 1 (plus or minus 1/8") is 8 ¾ inches wide by 14 ¼ inches long with rounded ends. Targets in this group are the black bear, grizzly bear, deer, moose, elk, and caribou. A bonus 9 cm dot (valued ELEVEN points) is located in the middle of the high scoring area and colored SUNSET OR-ANGE on dark targets and light targets.
- 2.3 The high scoring area of Group No. 2 (plus or minus 1/8") is 6 ¾ inches wide by 10 ¼ inches long with rounded ends. Targets in this group are the small black bear, NFAA 2024/2025 53 antelope, small deer, wolf,

and mountain lion. A bonus 7 cm dot (valued ELEVEN points) is located in the middle of the high scoring area and colored SUNSET ORANGE on dark targets and light targets.

- 2.4 The high scoring area of Group No. 3 (plus or minus 1/8") is 4 ¼ inches wide by 6 ¾ inches long with rounded ends. Targets in this group are the coyote, raccoon, javelina, turkey, fox, goose, wildcat, and pheasant. A bonus 5 cm dot (valued ELEVEN pointS) is located in the middle of the high scoring area and colored SUNSET ORANGE on dark targets and light targets.
- 2.5 The high scoring area of Group No. 4 (plus or minus 1/8") is 2 inches wide by 3 3/8 inches long with rounded ends. Targets in this group are the turtle, duck, grouse, crow, skunk, woodchuck, jack rabbit, and rock-chuck. A bonus 3 cm dot (valued ELEVEN points) is located in the middle of the high scoring area and colored SUNSET ORANGE on dark targets and light targets.

RATIONALE: (Describe briefly existing problem and expected benefit of proposed change)

The individual/s that are have purchased a bow for hunting purposes and have been equipped with slider sights with no magnification have no real opportunity to compete in the NFAA at the current time and be on the same level of competition as their peers. With the increasing rise in moveable single pin and muti-pin referred to as "Slider Sights" being sold and used on bowhunting setups across the country there is a need for a division separating these individuals from Bowhunter Freestyle (which uses no more than 5 fixed pins and no adjustment of the sight once shooting begins) and Freestyle (which allows for any length bar and magnification to be used). Other organizations have introduced a "Modern Bowhunter" or Hunter 45 class that has all the same rules as Bowhunter Freestyle but with the change that a competitor may use a moveable slider sight and no magnification.

I would propose that the NFAA takes up and creates a new division called Modern Bowhunter Freestyle division. Here in Oklahoma alone we have approximately 20 individuals that compete on the Archery Shooters Association in the Hunter 45 division which has been around for 2 years now. At the national level it is seeing 40-60 Participants with that number growing. In Oklahoma we have been approached by many competitors asking for such a division to be created so that they can compete on an even playing field.

I would anticipate that in the 1st year we would see a conservative 5-10 per state increase in memberships with that increasing yearly by 50% in the first 3 years. With the right dissemination of information from the National Level and putting a spotlight on the division we could see those numbers increase faster as well as spotlighting the new division at a local and regional level as well can drive up membership and tournament participation.

Benefits: Even playing field, Less money having to be spent by the competitor, Ability to buy and shoot one setup, increase in participation numbers across the country which increases revenue dollars.

Note: As a pro-shop owner our moveable sight sales account for 80% of our sight revenue.

K. Modern Freestyle Bowhunter:

1. Any sight and scope maybe used as long as the scope itself does not contain any lens in front of or behind the pin/s. Scopes with lenses, clickers and draw checks are not allowed. A sight pin consisting of a housing with a hole through it, that does not contain a fixed reference point within the hole, is not allowed.

- 2. Release aids will be permitted. In the case of physical disability of the arms or hands, a chew strap may be used in place of fingers or release aids.
- 3. A pinguard mounted on the sight, and a level mounted anywhere will be legal in this style of shooting.
- 4. A string of suitable material with a center serving and end servings of the same or different color than the string may be used. One consistent nocking point only is permitted. Nocking point locators shall not extend more than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch above or below the arrow nock when at full draw. Brush buttons and string silencers properly attached will be legal.

The Rules Interpretation Committee (RIC) has ruled on this subject in 2013 and 2016. The rulings of the RIC. are not incorporated into the bylaws for transparency for our members. Agenda item WI-01 addresses incorporating RIC rulings in the By-laws. Agenda item WI-04 addresses incorporating RIC Master List in the By-laws and adding on-line access.

Precedent:

RULES INTERPRETATION COMMITTEE 2013-2

The RIC Committee reviewed the decision by the California Director as well as the applicable NFAA Equipment Rules as stated in the 2012-2013 NFAA Constitution & By-Laws and RIC rulings that were made and upheld in previous years.

Page 86 of the "General Policy" section of the NFAA Constitution & By-Laws; specifically **BDC-8-1980**, states that: "The written word and not the intent be used to interpret the Constitution and By-laws items." Stabilizer equipment rules for Bowhunter, Freestyle Bowhunter and Freestyle Limited Bowhunter read as follows: "One <u>straight</u> stabilizer, coupling device included if used...".

That being said, it is the decision of the RIC Committee that the stabilizer rod **and** coupling device, if used, must be "straight or inline" with the threaded hole or insert of the bow riser – i.e. perpendicular to the bow riser.

The use of a commercially or home made coupler that would allow the stabilizer to deviate from being "straight or inline", or cause an "offset or drop", from the threaded hole of the bow riser, would be ILLEGAL.

Precedent:

RULES INTERPRETATION COMMITTEE DECISION 2016-2

The RIC Committee reviewed the decision by the Texas Director as well as the applicable NFAA Equipment Rules (Page 31, By-Laws, Article II, Section F {Freestyle Bowhunter} and Section G {Freestyle Limited Bowhunter}, as stated in the 2015-2016 NFAA Constitution & By-Laws.

The RIC Committee unanimously agrees with the decision of the Texas Director that the "Doinker Archery A-Bar Field Stabilizer" is **ILLEGAL** in Freestyle Bowhunter and Freestyle Limited Bowhunter styles of competition. (see photo next page)

Additionally, the NFAA Equipment Rules for "Competitive Bowhunter" and "Traditional" styles of competition mandate a "Straight Stabilizer". Therefore, the RIC Committee unanimously rules that the "Doinker Archery A-Bar Field Stabilizer" is **ILLEGAL** in the Competitive Bowhunter and Traditional styles of competition.




